<p><b>Swimming:</b> The local swimming pool was unable to be accessed by the school or the public during the 2020-21 academic year due to the Covid 19 Pandemic. Therefore, the school is unable to provide up-to-date data of how many of the year 6 students are able to swim 25m at the end of Year 6.</p> <p><b>Action:</b> 2021-22 PE Premium expenditure will be utilised to ensure students who have missed out of swimming due to facility closures will have access to additional swimming within the curriculum.</p>	
<p><b>Sustainability:</b> Fen Ditton Primary understand the importance of sustainability when it comes to the PE and School Sport premium expenditure.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Extra-Curricular clubs are promoted to offer additional opportunities for children to be active outside of the school day. The aims of these clubs are to inspire pupils and achieve enthusiastic movers who seek opportunities to find an activity which suits them.</li> <li>• Increasing physical activity throughout the school day as a way of increasing the student’s moving time and promoting health and fitness is a big target for the next few academic years, particularly in response to the physical activity time lost during the pandemic. We have developed a culture of active lunchtimes at Fen Ditton and offer a range of different sports and physical activities for children to take part in. We are now working towards training our year 6 children to take on some of these leadership responsibilities to ensure the sustainability of what we have built up over the last few years using qualified coaches.</li> <li>• Purchasing physical equipment to promote additional uptake in extra-curricular clubs and introducing new sports within the curriculum are resources, which Fen Ditton Primary will retain ownership, increasing the offer of activities that can be utilised at school for years to come.</li> <li>• Membership to the Cambridge School Sports Partnership and additional experiences offered to our year 6 pupils provides students with positive experiences and memories which can inspire students to be physically active throughout their lives. The increase of opportunities allows students the chance to further develop their appreciation of being physically active in their lives and will be inspired to seek opportunities in the community to further develop their enjoyment in their chosen activities.</li> </ul>
