









Dragonflies Class

Overall, it was a busy and exciting week where everyone is starting to settle very well into the new routines and environment of our class!








Squirrels Class

Exploring mixtures in Science.





In Science this week, we have started our unit of mixtures and separation. We explored how mixtures are made and investigated whether they can be easily identified. Through an experiment, we discovered that not all mixtures are easy to spot, especially when substances share the same colour. However, we learned that mixtures can often be identified by looking closely at their colours, materials, and shapes. Using the iPads, we also researched everyday substances like sand, seawater, and soil and discovered what they were made out of.

This week, the children took a big step in building a more positive and resilient approach to learning. In class, we focused on the difference between a fixed and growth mindset, and we practiced changing the way we think and talk about challenges











<u>Home Learning</u> <u>Autumn term update</u>

This year, we're excited to launch a refreshed approach to home learning that encourages creativity, independence, and deeper engagement with the curriculum. Each half term, children will receive a Home Learning Menu – a selection of open-ended

tasks linked to their current learning in school. These tasks are designed to be flexible and creative, allowing children to respond in a way that suits their interests and strengths. They may choose to create models, write stories, produce artwork, or carry out research – the possibilities are wide-ranging and purposeful.

The aim is to develop key skills such as **self-study**, **time management**, **and presentation of knowledge**, while also making home learning enjoyable and meaningful.

Children can choose the order in which they complete the tasks over the half term.
