## **Home Learning**



#### Home Learning - A Refreshed Approach

Following on from last week's newsletter piece, you will know that this half term, we are introducing a refreshed approach to home learning through a menu of tasks for each year group. The aim is to give children and families more flexibility and choice in how home learning is approached.

Over the course of the half term, children are expected to complete all of the tasks from the menu. However, the order, the depth, and when they are handed in is up to each family. Some children may choose to spend more than a week exploring one task in detail, while responding more quickly to others. Others may prefer to work steadily through one task a week. Both approaches are absolutely fine — one a week is simply a guide to help pace the learning across the half term.

Alongside these projects, there are still regular weekly expectations for all children:

- Reading
- Times tables practice
- Spelling (introduced from next half term)
- In some year groups, additional Maths/English tasks

This balance allows children to consolidate their core skills regularly while also enjoying the chance to explore a variety of creative and open-ended tasks at their own pace.





## News from our classrooms



#### **Butterflies Class**

We've had such a wonderful week in Butterflies! The children have been full of curiosity, laughter, and creativity, and it's been a joy to see them grow in confidence as they explore new learning opportunities. From sharing stories and building friendships to getting handson with exciting activities, every day has been filled with moments of discovery and pride. We can't wait to share some of the highlights with you and celebrate all the amazing things the children have achieved this week!



In maths this week, we have been enjoying lots of singing and movement as we explored number songs together. From counting down in "Five Little Speckled Frogs" to building up in "One, Two, Buckle My Shoe," the children have been practising saying numbers in order and hearing how they fit together. We also worked on recognising and ordering numbers, using games and practical activities to help the children spot which number comes next and where numbers belong in a sequence. It's been lovely to see their confidence growing as they join in with the songs and use their number knowledge in play.



In English, we have continued diving into the traditional tale of The Three Little Pigs. The children loved listening to the story and joining in with the repeated phrases, especially when the Big Bad Wolf tried to blow the houses down! We explored the characters and settings, talking about how the pigs showed resilience and problem-solving. The children also had opportunities to retell the story in their own words, using props and role play to bring it to life. Through these activities, they developed their speaking, listening, and storytelling skills while building confidence in using new vocabulary.





#### **Butterflies Class continued...**







In Understanding the World, we investigated all about ponds and the creatures that live there, linked to our favourite song Five Little Speckled Frogs. The children explored what a pond habitat looks like and discovered why it is such an important home for frogs and other wildlife. Through songs, stories, and pictures, the children began to make connections between their singing and the real world of nature.



Our Year Ones have started investigating how beans can grow without soil by placing them in clear containers with just water and paper towel. We are very excited to see the roots and shoots begin to appear, watching closely. This hands-on experiment helps with understanding that plants need water and light to grow and gave them the chance to make careful observations and predictions about what might happen next.

Finally, please remember to send your child's book bag and reading book into school every day. This helps us to listen to the children read regularly and ensures they can take part in reading activities with their group, supporting your child's progress and enjoyment of reading. #### **Squirrels Class**

This week in Squirrel Class, we have been working very hard in Maths! We have completed lots of place value activities with numbers up to 1000 and have been enjoying practising our times tables on TT Rockstars.

In our other learning, we have been practising writing in the first person. We have also been exploring the features of diary entries in preparation for writing our own as Spontaneous Cyril from our English text, 'The Squirrels Who Squabbled'.

We have also been enjoying painting in our Art lessons and learning about Skara Brae, a Stone Age settlement, in History. We particularly enjoyed exploring an interactive map of this!













#### **Owls Class**

What an exciting week Owls class have had! This week, our brilliant Year 5 Owls began their swimming lessons and what a splash they made! With excitement, the children showed great enthusiasm as they went into the water to see how far they could swim and they supported one another throughout. These sessions are a fantastic opportunity to develop both physical ability and water safety awareness. We're so proud of how well the Owls have started and can't wait to see their progress over the coming weeks.

In science, we stepped into the role of young investigators. We conducted an experiment exploring how mixtures can be separated using sieving. We worked together to separate materials based on particle size, learning how this method is used in real- life situations. It was a brilliant hands-on session that combined curiosity, collaboration, and scientific thinking.
