News from our classrooms



Butterflies Class

We've had a couple of wonderful weeks in Butterflies, the children have been full of energy and enthusiasm, showing great curiosity in their play and learning. Each day brings new discoveries—whether it's experimenting in the creative areas, exploring outdoors, or joining in with songs and stories together. It has been a joy to watch their confidence continue to grow as they share ideas, try new activities, and develop their independence. We are so proud of how well they are engaging with new challenges and sharing their ideas with each other.



In English, we have been exploring Floella Benjamin's story Coming to England. The children listened carefully as we shared Floella's journey and talked about the themes of family, belonging and kindness. They enjoyed discussing how it might feel to move somewhere new and thought about things we would need to take with us on a long journey. We compared England to Trinidad and they made passports for their role-play, helping them to develop their vocabulary, storytelling skills and empathy for others.

In Maths, the children have been developing their early problem-solving skills through sorting activities. They explored a range of objects and talked about the different ways they could be grouped, such as by colour, size, shape or type. The children enjoyed working together to explain their choices and noticing when objects could belong to more than one group. These activities have helped them to build important mathematical language and reasoning skills, as well as laying strong foundations for future number work.

Butterflies Class continued....




In Understanding the World, the children took part in an exciting bug hunt around our forest school area. Armed with magnifying glasses and lots of curiosity, they searched carefully under logs, in the grass and amongst the leaves to see what minibeasts they could find. The children were fascinated by the different creatures they discovered, from wiggly worms to speedy beetles, and enjoyed talking about where the bugs live and how they move. This activity helped them to build their observation skills, ask questions, and think about the importance of caring for living things in our environment.

When we investigated how shadows are formed in our Science lesson we learned new vocabulary through our exciting experiment.

Owls Class


What an exciting week Owls have had! We were thrilled and very lucky to take part in two dance workshops with Dance Fusion on Tuesday and Wednesday morning. We dived into the emotional systems of Drive, Threat, and Soothe, discovering how to express these powerful feelings through movement. The energy and creativity from every Owl was truly inspiring.

In Science, we became real explorers as we investigated solutions, conducting hands on experiments to see exactly what solutions look like and how they behave. Meanwhile, in Art, we dived into the fascinating world of Cai Guo-Qiang's installation art. Inspired by his famous gunpowder drawings, we crafted our very own mini installations using powder paint and glitter. A delightfully messy but hugely fun creative adventure!

Meanwhile in English, we sharpened our storytelling skills by writing third-person narratives. We uncovered how a narrator can reveal so much more about characters emotions and add depth to a story. In Maths, we've kicked off our addition and subtraction unit, mastering the column method to confidently handle numbers with more than four digits.














Pre-order Your 2025 Fen Ditton Tea Towel Keepsake


