Exciting Playground Update!


We are delighted to share that our playground will soon have brand-new markings installed on the newly surfaced area. This exciting development will take place from Monday 13th to Wednesday 15th October.

 - Collection will take place from the car park, beginning at 3:15pm (instead of the usual 3:30pm) to allow for a safe, staggered dismissal process.

Dragonflies Class

We have had another fun filled, busy week in Dragonfly Class.

Everyone had an amazing time in history exploring the difference between toys and memories of different generations. Mrs Tabram and Miss Bicheno brought in a variety of memories from their childhoods which the children had a great time talking about and sorting into the correct groups.

PE has been a huge hit over the last two weeks, with a focus on dribbling and kicking balls with focus and control. All the children did a fantastic job of dribbling footballs and stopping them with their feet and played a variety of games to practise these skills.

During music we have been exploring dynamics (quiet and loud sounds) to create soundscapes of a seaside. This week everyone loved using a wide range of instruments to create the soundscape of a calm, relaxing ocean.

On top of all of this fabulous fun, the class have also been working hard to ensure they understand addition and number bonds to 10 and 20 in maths. Using lots of practical equipment to support them with this skill. During English we have focused closely on describing the colour monsters and have had fun using similes and a range of adjectives to make our writing exciting. Working towards writing a missing poster for our red colour monster who ran away!

The children have shown great enthusiasm and creativity, and we are incredibly proud of their efforts.














Pre-order Your 2025 Fen Ditton Tea Towel Keepsake


