## News from our classrooms

#### **Butterfies Class**

We hope you all had a lovely half-term break. The children have come back full of energy and excitement, ready for another busy half term of learning and fun! This half term, we'll be exploring the changing seasons, celebrating festivals such as Christmas, and continuing to develop our phonics, maths, and creative skills through lots of hands-on activities. It's set to be a magical and memorable time of year in EYFS!



In **English**, our learning has been inspired by the beautiful story How to Catch a Star by Oliver Jeffers. The children have loved exploring the themes of dreams, determination and curiosity as we followed the boy's adventure to catch his very own star. We've enjoyed hot-seating, retelling the story, creating our own starry artwork, and taking part in space-themed investigations and challenges. Through this story, the children have been developing their imagination, language skills, and understanding of the world around them.


In **maths** this week, we have been exploring the concept of one more and one less. The children have enjoyed using practical resources such as cubes, number lines, and everyday objects to find what happens when we add or take away one. We've been singing number songs, playing counting games, and solving simple problems together. The children are becoming more confident in recognising number patterns and using mathematical language to describe their thinking.





### **Butterfies Class continued....**

We've been exploring the wonderful changes of the autumn season. The children have been noticing the different colours, shapes and textures of leaves during our outdoor learning and used their collections to create beautiful autumn leaf necklaces. We also looked at fireworks and created our own dazzling firework patterns using paint, glitter, and a range of creative materials. These activities have helped the children to develop their fine motor skills, creativity, and understanding of the world around them.



As we come to the end of a busy first week, we'd like to thank all our families for their continued support; it would be wonderful to see as many as possible of you at our **Stay and Play session (Reception children ONLY) next Monday** — the children will love sharing their learning and showing you around their classroom. We've also started rehearsals for our **Nativity play**, which promises to be a special celebration of all the children's hard work and confidence.

#### **Squirrels Class**

This week, Squirrel Class have enthusiastically returned to school! We've enjoyed discussing our holidays and being excited for Bonfire Night.

In **Maths**, we have been working hard to finish our unit of work about Addition and Subtraction. We have been learning how to round to the nearest ten and hundred so that we can estimate answers to questions. We have also been learning about inverse operations and how addition and subtraction are opposites.

In **English**, we have begun our new book called Cloud Busting by Malorie Blackman. We have been introduced to the characters of Sam and Davey, and how it has been written in a poetry-style. We have taken it in turns to read the verses aloud to the class.

In **Geography**, we have begun our new topic 'Who lives in Antarctica?' We used atlases to located the equator and lines of longitude and latitude to find Antarctica on a world map.

This week in **DT**, we have begun to look at the theme of structures. We investigated different structures by attaching cocktail sticks together using playdough. You can see these in the pictures we took.







Finally, we are starting to look at databases in our **computing** lesson. We compared the data on Top Trump Cards as an introduction to the topic.





#### Owls Class

What a fantastic start to the new term! In **English**, we've started exploring our new text, The Big History Timeline. The children have been making thoughtful predictions about what they think the book will cover. We've also started working on Fronted Adverbials and Time Connectives which are key tools we'll be using in our upcoming biography writing next week.





In **Maths**, we've had a lively and active few days! Through hands-on activities, we've been reinforcing our understanding of composite, prime, square, and cube numbers. Everyone had a brilliant time. We've also started learning how to multiply and divide by 10, 100, and 1,000, using our place value knowledge to guide us.



Before the half-term break, we were lucky to enjoy a **STEM Day** packed with exciting challenges. From bridge building and maze navigation to launching rocket mice, the children were fully immersed in problemsolving and creativity. It was a wonderful, fun and engaging day.

Looking ahead, we're excited to dive into our new **Geography** unit focused on population and in **DT** we'll be getting crafty by making our very own sock monkeys!
