News from our classrooms

Dragonflies Class

Our first two weeks back at school for Autumn 2 have been jam packed full of new learning and fun.


In **PE** the children have embraced the new skill of parkour. They loved practicing their jumping skills, over varying objects and with varying foot sequences. Th whole lesson was done to music which they also absolutely loved.

The **nativity practice** has set off to a great start with 6 songs being learnt ready for the play. The children have been enthusiastic about the singing, the staging, the costumes and the parts that they will play.

In **English**, we have moved on to learning about 'The Storm Whale in Winter'. This is a book about a little boy who is saved from a frozen boat by a whale. The children have loved exploring this text, discussing how characters feel throughout the story, describing the storm and now developing their knowledge of whales to write a fun informative fact file about whales.

The children have embraced the concept of challenge this half term with some new vocabulary being used in lessons. We have focused on challenges being 'Golden Dragonflies' and 'Crystal Dragonflies' to help them push themselves in their learning and feel accomplished by meeting new challenges every lesson.

A busy half term is in full swing, but Dragonflies are stepping up and having lots of fun in the process!










Hedgehogs Class

This week we began our exciting new topic on structures. Using toothpicks and plasticine, we experimented with creating different shapes and discovered which ones had the strongest bases. The children showed fantastic creativity and problem-solving skills!

Next week, we'll move into the planning phase as we start to design our very own pavilions.



In **Science**, we explored the amazing framework that supports our bodies: human bones. The children drew skeletons and carefully labelled the key bones, learning how each one helps us move, stand tall, and stay protected.

In **Maths**, we have started our journey into multiplication and division. The children are already spotting patterns and making links between the two operations. To keep practicing, don't forget to use TT Rockstars heatmaps at home to remind you of your target times tables. Regular practice will make a huge difference!





Well done Hedgehogs! It's been a busy and brilliant week of learning.






Badgers Class


This week's class assembly was a fantastic celebration of the Badgers class! Our students shone brightly as they showcased their hard work, creativity, and teamwork.


Everyone could see the confidence and enthusiasm they bring into every activity.

Children who suffer from nut allergies can develop a severe, potentially life-threatening allergic reaction, it is not just eating nuts that can cause a severe reaction, just being touched on the skin or smelling the breath of someone who has had nuts or a product containing nuts can trigger anaphylactic shock (which can cause breathing and swallowing difficulties).

We do have children in our school that have severe nut allergies.

First aid staff in the school are trained to use the Epi-pens (an injection of adrenalin) which is required immediately if this happens. **We cannot have nuts in school in any form**. So please can we ask that you have no nut products in the lunch boxes or brought into the school as treats.

For example: Peanut butter sandwiches, chocolate spreads, cereal bars, some granola bars, cakes that contain nuts, biscuits/cookies that contain nuts, peanut butter, some Asian food, including satay sauces that contain nuts.

This list is not exhaustive, so please check the packaging of products closely. We appreciate that this is an additional thing to check and we know that you recognise the

importance of it.

We are a nut-free school

Please do not bring in any nut-based products into school or in packed lunches
