News from our classrooms

Butterflies Class

As we step into the colder months, we hope you're all keeping warm and cosy! The children have been full of energy and enthusiasm despite the drop in temperature, and we've been enjoying lots of exciting learning both indoors and outdoors. Please remember to send your child in with a warm coat, hat, and gloves each day so they can comfortably take part in our outdoor activities. We're looking forward to a wonderful few weeks of seasonal learning and festive fun!

In **English**, we have been exploring the story The Squirrels Who Squabbled. The children enjoyed meeting Bruce and Cyril, two squirrels who learn an important lesson about sharing after racing and arguing over the very last pine cone of the season. We discussed how their squabbling caused even more problems and how teamwork and kindness helped them in the end. The class had great fun acting out the story, describing the characters' feelings, and thinking about how we can be good friends just like the squirrels eventually became.

In our small world area this week, the children have been exploring an autumnthemed setup inspired by our story. Using pine cones, leaves, logs, and woodland animals, the children recreated scenes from the story and invented their own adventures for Bruce and Cyril. They practised turn-taking as they gathered "food for winter," built cosy nests, and acted out the squirrels' journey from squabbling to working together. This rich, hands-on play encouraged language development, imagination, and conversations all set within a beautiful autumn woodland scene.

In **Maths** this week, we have been exploring the numbers 4 and 5 through lots of practical activities and play. The children enjoyed counting and arranging groups of 4 and 5 objects, as well as spotting these numbers in our classroom environment. We also linked our learning to the nursery rhyme Incy Wincy Spider, using the rhyme to practise counting spider's legs and subitising numbers to 6. These hands-on activities helped the children recognise the numbers, understand their value, and develop their counting skills in a fun and familiar way.

We are continuing with our **Nativity rehearsals** this week, and the children are doing a wonderful job learning their lines, songs, and actions—our festive excitement is definitely building! We're also looking forward to a **fun sports event next Wednesday 26th at Marleigh school**. The Reception children will be walking to and from the Marleigh site and taking part in a **Sitting Volleyball/ Inclusive Games activity**. It promises to be an enjoyable and energetic week for everyone!


Squirrels Class


Squirrel Class have really enjoyed **Computing**, learning about different types of databases. We had to consider the positives and negatives of paper versus electronic databases and decide what we thought was best to use.

In **Maths**, we have continued to learn about multiplication and division. We have practised grouping and sharing using different equipment including Numicon, Dienes, Counters and Coins. We are continuing to work hard on our three-times tables too!

We have also enjoyed a presentation by a member of the British Antarctic Survey and were lucky enough to see pictures of what it is like to be a researcher in Antarctica. We then imagined that we were explorers and wrote our own postcards home!

Additionally, we have begun **practising for our Class Assembly** - we are excited to showcase our learning soon!

Over the past few weeks, Owls have been busy shining across all subjects!


We completed our biography writing unit, focusing on two inspirational figures from history — Emmeline Pankhurst and Rosa Parks. The children produced amazing biographies, packed with fascinating facts, fronted adverbials and time connectives. Their writing was not only informative but also beautifully structured- a real credit to their hard work and creativity.

Owls have also made a fantastic start to our fractions unit in **Maths**. They've quickly grasped key concepts, exploring equivalent fractions, converting mixed numbers into improper fractions, and even beginning to compare and order fractions. Their confidence and enthusiasm in tackling these challenges has been wonderful to see.

In **Music**, our Egyptian music unit has been a real highlight!
Owls sang "The Gift of the Nile" with great energy and
expression. They then took on the challenge of playing the piece
on the xylophone and impressed Miss Joynes with their
determination and teamwork. It was tricky, but their
perseverance shone through!













Pupil Premium Funding - Apply Now

We are encouraging you to check whether your child may be eligible for **Pupil Premium** funding. This is additional government funding provided to schools to support children's learning and wellbeing. It helps us to offer extra tuition, resources, and enrichment opportunities.

Eligibility is linked to certain benefits, including Universal Credit, Income Support, Jobseeker's Allowance, military families and others. Even if your child already receives free school meals (or has done in the last 6 years), applying for Pupil Premium ensures the school receives extra funding.

If you think you may be eligible, we strongly encourage you to apply. This funding makes a real difference to the support we can provide for your child and others in our school community.
