News from our classrooms

Dragonflies Class

Dragonflies are continuing to work super hard in the Autumn term to learn lots of new things.



In **maths** they have been working on numbers to 100, partitioning them into tens and ones and comparing and ordering these numbers. They enjoyed working practically in partners to do this with a wide variety of numbers this week.

They have worked extremely hard in **English** over the last two weeks to write fact files about whales. They worked together to learn new facts about whales under the subheadings: Diet, Habitat, Appearance and Fun Facts, then they worked on putting all their facts together into an eye-catching fact file for others to read.

Science was a highlight for all when exploring how the trees look in different seasons. They used paint to create a tree for each season of the year. They had to think carefully about which colours to use to create an accurate representation of the trees.

During **PE** the class have been working on their parkour skills with Mr Parker. They have had lots of fun exploring jumping, rolling and running using various equipment and directions to make it interesting and fun.

Finally, our **nativity rehearsals** are off to an amazing start! The children have been incredible at practicing their lines and working on following stage directions to put on an amazing show. They can't wait to perform it!









Hedgehogs Class

It has been another busy and exciting week in Hedgehogs Class!

We began by celebrating the children's fantastic performance in last week's **Showcase Assembly**. They spoke clearly, performed confidently, and demonstrated how much they have learned this term.

In **Science**, we explored the human skeleton further by measuring the length of some of our bones and considering how these relate to the muscles in our bodies. We also started discussing how muscles work in pairs to help us move, which the children found fascinating.

In **Maths**, we have continued building confidence with multiplication and division. The children have been working hard using different strategies to solve problems and explain their reasoning.

A highlight of last week was our **inclusive sports event** against Marleigh, where we played boccia and seated volleyball. The children represented Fen Ditton brilliantly, showing teamwork, respect, and a wonderful sporting attitude.

In **English**, we launched our new unit on biographies by exploring modern activists who have inspired positive change in the world today. The children showed great interest in the life of Malala Yousafzai, researching her story and learning how her bravery and determination have helped advocate for girls' education globally.












Badgers Class

Using table story maps, they have explored structure and sequence before bravely taking on the challenge of writing the next chapter of their own narratives. Their creativity and vocabulary have been outstanding, it has been a joy to see their confidence as writers grow.

PSHE – Looking After Ourselves

In PSHE, we've been reflecting on the importance of taking responsibility for our own health. The children have discussed practical ways to look after both their mental and physical wellbeing, showing maturity and empathy in their ideas.


Science - Forces and Electricity











House Points





Pupil Premium Funding - Apply Now

We are encouraging you to check whether your child may be eligible for **Pupil Premium** funding. This is additional government funding provided to schools to support children's learning and wellbeing. It helps us to offer extra tuition, resources, and enrichment opportunities.

Eligibility is linked to certain benefits, including Universal Credit, Income Support, Jobseeker's Allowance, military families and others. Even if your child already receives free school meals (or has done in the last 6 years), applying for Pupil Premium ensures the school receives extra funding.

If you think you may be eligible, we strongly encourage you to apply. This funding makes a real difference to the support we can provide for your child and others in our school community.
