Butterflies Class

As we move into this magical time of year, we are excited to begin our **Christmas preparations** in Butterflies. Over the next few weeks, the children will be taking part in a variety of festive activities designed to support their learning and creativity while celebrating the season together.



In **English**, this week we have been enjoying the story Stick Man by Julia Donaldson. The children have loved joining in with the repeated phrases and exploring Stick Man's exciting journey. We have been talking about how Stick Man feels as he tries to find his way home. The children have also taken part in related mark-making and creative activities, including designing their own Stick Man characters. It has been wonderful to see their imagination and storytelling skills growing throughout the week.

As part of our **Understanding the World learning**, the children made their own "snow" using baking soda and hair conditioner. They explored how the two ingredients change when mixed together and talked about the texture, temperature, appearance of the snow they created. The children enjoyed squeezing, moulding, and building with the mixture, which supported their scientific curiosity, vocabulary development, and sensory exploration. It wonderful was to see them experimenting, predicting, and working together as they investigated this winter-themed activity

Butterflies Class



In Maths this week, we have been thinking about the concept of zero and not zero. The children explored what it means when there is nothing there by looking at empty sets, counting objects, and comparing groups that had "some" and groups that had "none." Through practical activities such as sorting, matching, and using ten children developed frames. the their understanding that zero represents the absence of quantity. They enjoyed investigating this idea in playful ways, using manipulatives and problemsolving to build confidence with early number concepts

We have been continuing with our **Nativity rehearsals** this week and are looking forward to our Dress Rehearsal to the school this Friday and performing to you all next Tuesday and Wednesday!

Squirrels Class





In **Maths**, we have enjoyed being active! We have been working in our table teams to practise our multiplication and related division facts.

In **DT**, we have been practising weaving by using different strips of paper. We had to be very patient to keep everything in place!

In **French**, we have enjoyed describing 2d shapes by their size and colour to create abstract pictures in the style of Henri Matisse.

We have also worked very hard on practising for our class assembly; Miss Norman and Mrs Tabram are very proud of how well we have done!

What an incredible two weeks it's been for Owls!

Last week, Owls had a fantastic opportunity to visit the **AstraZeneca Discovery Centre for an inspiring STEM morning**. hey dived into the fascinating world of medicine-making, learning how medicines are created and even getting handson practice with pipettes! Our Owls were brilliantambassadorsfor Fen Ditton, showing curiosity, respect and enthusiasm every step of the way.



We also had our **class assembly last Thursday!** After lots of hard work rehearsing, Owls confidently shared their learning to everyone with clear and expressive voices, putting on a truly memorable performance.

In **Maths**, we've been sharpening up our fraction skills, focusing on adding and subtracting fractions. The children discovered just how important knowing their times tables is for finding equivalent fractions and have been working really hard to become experts in their times tables.

Owls have really enjoyed working on their Woolly Mammoth fact files in **English**. They worked together to learn facts about Woolly Mammoths and created a fact file with lots of facts and technical vocabulary under the subheadings: Diet, Habitat, Appearance, Behaviour and Fun Facts. Lots of great and informative fact files were written.

Science lessons this week brought some exciting experiments as we explored reversible changes. The Owls made predictions and observed what happened when we heated items like crayons, lollipop sticks, chocolate chips, and water. The experiment sparked lots of interest and discussion about changes in materials and how some can be reversed.












House Points





Pupil Premium Funding - Apply Now

We are encouraging you to check whether your child may be eligible for **Pupil Premium** funding. This is additional government funding provided to schools to support children's learning and wellbeing. It helps us to offer extra tuition, resources, and enrichment opportunities.

Eligibility is linked to certain benefits, including Universal Credit, Income Support, Jobseeker's Allowance, military families and others. Even if your child already receives free school meals (or has done in the last 6 years), applying for Pupil Premium ensures the school receives extra funding.

If you think you may be eligible, we strongly encourage you to apply. This funding makes a real difference to the support we can provide for your child and others in our school community.
