# Whole School Maths Challenge & Santa Dash!

When the school gates open in the morning, 8.50am-9am: Parents will be welcomed to take part in a small maths-based challenge with their children. A couple of Christmas themed maths questions for each Key Stage will be set out in the playground for parents/ carers to solve with their children. All questions will be answered with actions! Jumping Jacks for 100s, Claps for 10s and Hops for 1s (Answer 321= 3 Jumping Jacks, 2 claps and 1 hop).

We are excited to show just a small way of how we can teach maths in an active, healthy way!

In the afternoon all children need to be ready to run!

Most important things to remember to make this event run smoothly is.

- Please make sure your child comes to school wearing suitable footwear.
- Bringing in a Santa hat or festive head-wear they can wear for the dash would be great!
- This is <u>not</u> a non uniform day. Children must be wearing uniform which could be PE kit, dressed comfortably and warmly enough to complete this outdoor activity.

# **Dragonflies Class**






Dragonflies have had another busy couple of weeks in class and have made incredible progress with their learning since the beginning of term!

In English, they have worked hard to write fact files about whales and setting descriptions of a blizzard (from our story 'The Storm Whale in Winter'). They used expanded noun phrases, ambitious adjectives, similes and the 5 senses to write an immersive description and they were amazing!

Last week the class thoroughly enjoyed the rocksteady workshops that we had. In the whole school assembly, they sang and danced along to songs they knew. During our Key Stage One workshop some of the children had a blast playing the instruments to the song 'We Will Rock You'.

The highlight of our last two weeks has been watching all the Key Stage One children perform their Nativity to the whole school and all their parents. They have blown us away with their confidence, public speaking and singing!









# **Hedgehogs Class**




This week, Hedgehogs enjoyed a **very special end-of-session celebration of Brain Buddies.**Over the past term, we have been learning strategies to help us feel calm and manage our emotions. It was wonderful to welcome so many parents into our classroom to share in what we've learnt. The children proudly demonstrated their techniques and showed how these strategies can support wellbeing both in school and at home.

In science, our focus has continued with food and nutrition. The children took part in an exciting information scavenger hunt, exploring the different food groups and discovering why a balanced diet is so important for our health. They worked brilliantly in teams, gathering facts and sharing their findings with one another.

On Friday, we had the incredible opportunity to join a **live Zoom call with the Antarctica – 2041 Champions of Antarctica**. The children were fascinated to learn what life is really like in Antarctica, from the extreme cold to the unique wildlife. Most importantly, we discovered why Antarctica is such a vital place for humanity and how protecting it helps safeguard our planet's future.

# PE & Whole-School Events – Santa Dash Preparation



# **Pupil Premium Funding - Apply Now**

We are encouraging you to check whether your child may be eligible for **Pupil Premium** funding. This is additional government funding provided to schools to support children's learning and wellbeing. It helps us to offer extra tuition, resources, and enrichment opportunities.

Eligibility is linked to certain benefits, including Universal Credit, Income Support, Jobseeker's Allowance, military families and others. Even if your child already receives free school meals (or has done in the last 6 years), applying for Pupil Premium ensures the school receives extra funding.

You can find full details of eligibility and apply online through the Cambridgeshire County Council website: Pupil Premium – Cambridgeshire County Council

If you think you may be eligible, we strongly encourage you to apply. This funding makes a real difference to the support we can provide for your child and others in our school community.
