Headteacher's insight

As we reach the end of the second week of the Spring term, it has been a pleasure to see how quickly pupils have settled back into routines and learning. Across the school, we are already seeing accelerated academic progress as children build on the strong foundations laid last term. Spring term is notorious for rates of progress to increase when children have the right environment to learn in.

Year 6 pupils are now entering their final two terms of primary school, and there is a real sense of purpose and determination among them. They are laser-focused on developing the knowledge, skills and independence needed to ensure they are fully prepared for the transition to secondary school. 

Dragonflies Class




Dragonflies have had a great start to the new year and are already learning so many new things!

In **Maths**, they have been working on developing their understanding of addition and subtraction to 100. Exploring how the tens and ones change when adding numbers and beginning to extend their knowledge of bridging ten when adding and subtracting. They have enjoyed using practical methods to support them with this.

In **English**, they have absolutely loved starting 'Grandad's Island' a book about a little boy and his grandad who go on an adventure to a desert island. This week they have focused on the setting of the book – a dense rainforest – where they enjoyed exploring the 5 senses for a rainforest and using lots of ambitious language to describe the setting.

The afternoons have been filled with exploring lots of new knowledge about the world. They have focused closely this week on safety. **PSHE** explored how to safely interact with adults and what to do if someone they don't know tries to talk to them and computing focused on how to stay safe when beginning to use the internet. The class had lots of insightful ideas and were very mature with their answers.

Art was a highlight this week as they began to explore paint and colour theory. The children used primary colours to create secondary colours and were very confident with how to mix colours. They are excited to develop their understanding of colour to create their own pieces of art.






Hedgehogs Class



Hedgehogs Class have had a brilliant start to the new term. The children have settled in beautifully and shown great enthusiasm for all of our new learning.


We have started our exciting new **Science topic** of rocks. The children became real rock investigators as they explored a variety of different rock types. They examined each one closely, looking carefully at properties such as texture, colour and hardness, and used these clues to identify and name the rocks. It has been wonderful to see their curiosity and scientific thinking grow.

In **English**, we have started our new class story, *The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe*. The children have been using clues from the text to make thoughtful predictions about what might happen next. Their ideas have been imaginative and detailed, and we are looking forward to exploring the story further as the term continues.





Badgers Class





Badgers Class have had a fantastic week of learning, filled with exciting discussions, creative thinking and lots of proud moments.

In **History**, we travelled back to the Tudor era to investigate how Henry VIII used propaganda, analysing different sources to understand how he shaped public opinion.

In **PSHE**, we began by talking about the importance of making mistakes and how they are expected, respected and learned from, before starting our SRE unit with a focus on the effects of alcohol and how it can influence choices and wellbeing.

Eligibility is linked to certain benefits, including Universal Credit, Income Support, Jobseeker's Allowance, military families and others. Even if your child already receives free school meals (or has done in the last 6 years), applying for Pupil Premium ensures the school receives extra funding.

Keep the Active Miles coming in and help your score travel the furthest! We would love to see some photos of you taking part in our challenge also. The weekend is fast approaching, lets see how many miles we can do as a school community.

Join Us for the RSPB Big Schools' Birdwatch!

We're excited to announce that we are taking part in the RSPB Big Schools' Birdwatch 2026, running from 6 January to 13 February! This is a nationwide activity where thousands of schools survey the birds visiting their school grounds, helping the **Royal Society for the Protection of Birds (RSPB)** understand more about bird life in the UK.

What will we be doing?

Each class will choose some time to go outside and observe the birds in our playground and outdoor spaces. Pupils will identify and count the birds they see, then we will submit these results online to the RSPB — even “zero” sightings matter!

This activity supports real scientific research into birds and biodiversity while encouraging children to get outdoors and connect with nature.

How can families join in?

You're welcome to take part at home too! Simply choose an hour over the weekend of the 23rd to the 26th January to watch the birds in your garden, local park or from your window, and record what you see. It's a fun way to explore wildlife together and contribute to a national project!
