

It's been a busy and happy week of learning, and we're looking forward to seeing what signs of Spring we can spot together next week!







Squirrels Class



Owls Class

Owls have had a wonderful week filled with creativity, curiosity and teamwork. They completed their **comparison texts**, exploring the similarities and differences between the wardrobe and Narnia. Their writing showed thoughtful ideas, clear structure and confident use of connectives to link their points.

In **Maths**, we began working on column multiplication and short division. These new methods can be challenging at first, but the Owls have shown real determination. Their perseverance is paying off, and they are now making strong progress with multiplying 2-digit numbers and dividing 4-digit numbers.

Science took us on an exciting journey into space. The children learnt about the shapes of the planets, their order in the solar system and the incredible speeds at which they orbit the Sun. A hands-on practical lesson brought the topic to life as the Owls became planets themselves, modelling orbits and movement around the sun.

To round off the week, the class took part in their first **Year 5 sports event** with Marleigh playing Matball. Every child demonstrated fantastic teamwork, encouragement and sportsmanship. It was brilliant to see them supporting one another and enjoying the experience together.





Join Us for the RSPB Big Schools' Birdwatch!

We're excited to announce that we are taking part in the RSPB Big Schools' Birdwatch 2026, running from 6 January to 13 February! This is a nationwide activity where thousands of schools survey the birds visiting their school grounds, helping the **Royal Society for the Protection of Birds (RSPB)** understand more about bird life in the UK.

What will we be doing?

Each class will choose some time to go outside and observe the birds in our playground and outdoor spaces. Pupils will identify and count the birds they see, then we will submit these results online to the RSPB — even “zero” sightings matter!

This activity supports real scientific research into birds and biodiversity while encouraging children to get outdoors and connect with nature.

How can families join in?

You're welcome to take part at home too! Simply choose an hour over the weekend of the 23rd to the 26th January to watch the birds in your garden, local park or from your window, and record what you see. It's a fun way to explore wildlife together and contribute to a national project!
