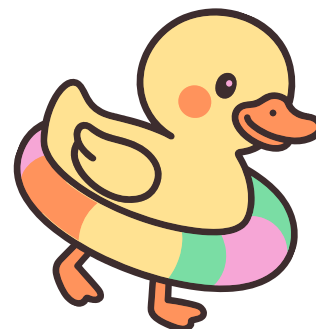

Good attendance helps children to:

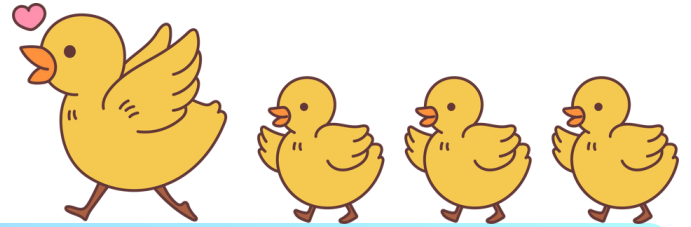
- ✓ Keep up with their learning

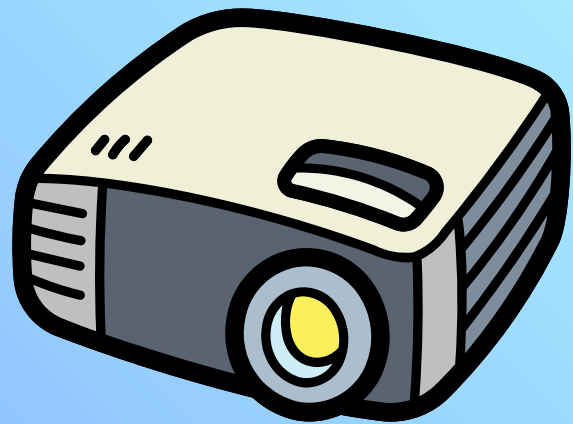

Butterflies Class

The children have had a wonderful week filled with energy and enthusiasm. What a wonderful time the Reception children had at our **EYFS Sports Event**. They loved practising their skills and team games, showing growing confidence and coordination. We were so proud of how they cheered one another on, took turns, and celebrated everyone's efforts. It was a joyful reminder of how physical play helps build not only strong bodies but also friendships, resilience, and a real sense of achievement!

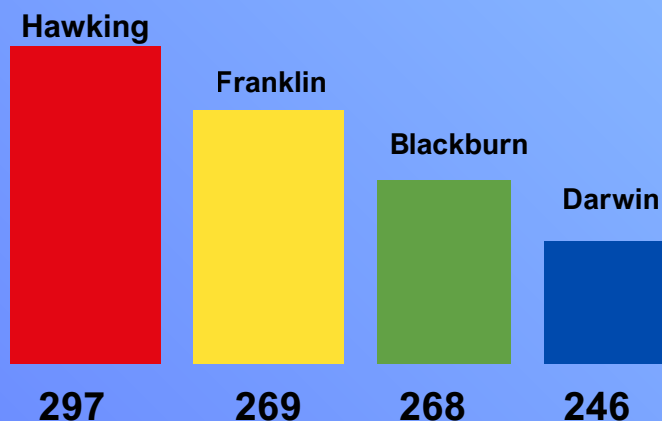
In **Science** we explored what happens to chocolate when it gets warm, predicting what they thought might happen if we placed one on the radiator, one outside and one in our hands. We each held a chocolate button in our hands for 2 minutes and noted how it changed. The children showed curiosity, used scientific language, and demonstrated good observation skills throughout the activity.

As we come towards the end of this busy half-term, the children have delighted us with their enthusiasm.

We are looking forward to Pancake Day activities and sharing kindness and creativity during our Valentine's Day celebrations next week.

Squirrels Class

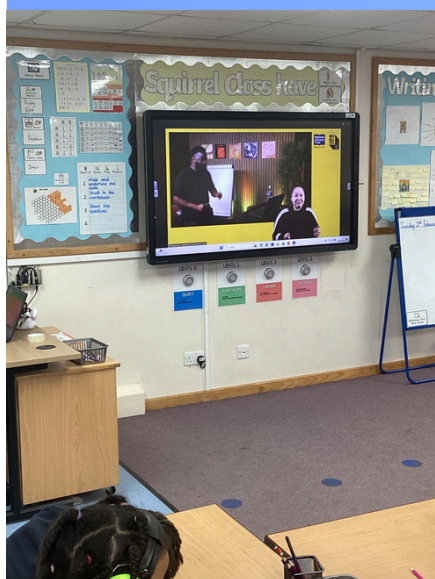
This week, Squirrel Class have been enjoying lots of active and practical learning!

We have been applying our knowledge of measuring to calculate the lengths of jumps in **Maths** and then extending this to calculate the perimeter of rectilinear shapes. We really enjoyed using the trundle wheels to calculate the perimeter of the playground and larger objects outside!

We have also enjoyed continuing our **Art projects**. We have painted our cardboard faces and started adding additional details - they are looking brilliant!

In **PSHE**, we completed a St John's Ambulance session about how to treat bites and stings, including what symptoms to look for if someone is having a severe allergic reaction. We then practised treating pretend bites and stings with a partner so that we could be sure about the correct steps to take.

We also enjoyed joining the online workshop for **National Storytelling Week** about how to use Rap to tell a story.



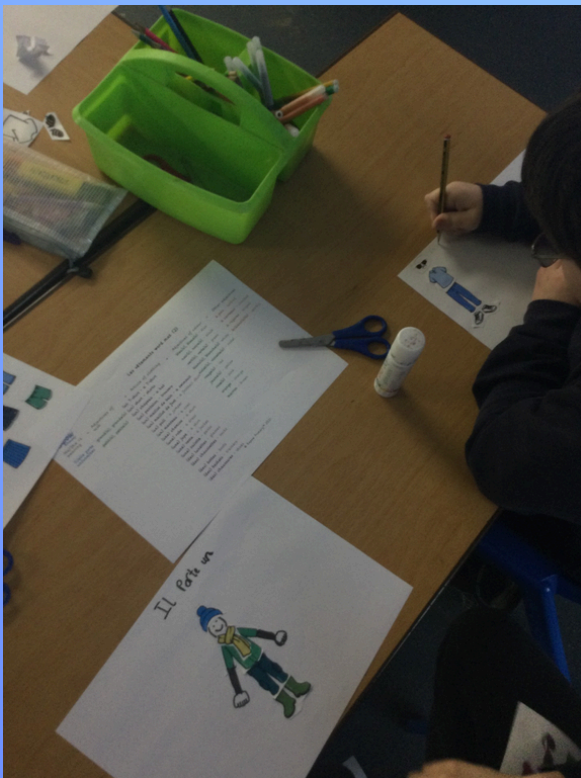


Owls Class

In **English**, Owls class have been busy crafting instructional texts on 'How to Survive Narnia'. To help enrich their writing, the children played adverb bingo and 'guess the adverb', which encouraged them to uplevel their vocabulary. They also worked hard to include fronted adverbials, imperative verbs, and expanded noun phrases. The results were impressive, with some excellent pieces of writing produced.

In **Science**, the class have been investigating how many moons each planet has and exploring how day and night occur. Their enthusiasm for this topic has been wonderful to see, and they have shown great curiosity during our discussions and activities.

In **French**, we have been learning vocabulary linked to clothes. The children created their own characters using a variety of clothing items and then wrote sentences to describe what their characters were wearing. This has been a fun and creative way to build confidence with new language.
